For the Psychology Concentration you must complete at least 7 courses, and meet the [3 specific requirements](#).

Only grades of C- or better may count toward the major; no pass-fail (except Spring 2020, Fall 2020, Spring 2021 and Fall 2021. For Spring 2024, CC and GS students were allowed to P up to two courses without restriction).

① **Science of Psychology:** UN1001, UN1021, S1001, or BC1001.

② **Statistics** (PSYC 1610 or STAT 1001, 1101, or 1201) **or Methods** (any course numbered PSYC 14xx).

③ **Breadth or Depth Requirement:** Either 1 course from each of the 3 groups, or 3 courses from 1 group:

Group I (Perception & Cognition): Any PSYC course in the 2200s, 3200s, or 4200s.

Group II (Psychobio & Neuroscience): Any PSYC course in the 2400s, 3400s, 4400s.

Group III (Social, Personality, & Abnormal): Any PSYC course in the 2600s, 3600s, or 4600s.

Additional restrictions to check:

At least 4 of the 7 courses were taken **at Columbia** (prefix of UN, GU, S); max 3 from Barnard/transfer.

No more than 2 of the 7 courses were **transferred** from an institution other than Columbia or Barnard.

No more than 1 of the 7 courses is **PSYC 3950** or another supervised research course.

Cognate courses from other departments that are approved to count toward the Special Elective of the PSYC Major can be counted as an elective toward the concentration; however, no more than 1 of the 7 courses may be from a **non-PSYC/NSBV** dept. (e.g., STAT, ECON, MATH, PHIL).
