No more than 2 of the 7 courses were transferred from an institution other than Columbia or Barnard.

No more than 1 of the 7 courses is **PSYC 3950** or another supervised research course.

Cognate courses from other departments that are approved to count toward the Special Elective of the PSYC Major can be counted as an elective toward the concentration; however, <u>no more than 1</u> of the 7 courses may be from a **non-PSYC/NSBV** dept. (e.g., STAT, ECON, MATH, PHIL).
