Barnard psych courses: Up to 9 Barnard points may be applied as elective credit without DUS approval. Transfer credit: Psych courses taken at other institutions require DUS approval and a grade of B- or better in order to count toward the major. No more than 9 transfer credits (including any Barnard points) may be applied toward the major.
