- 1 **Science of Psychology:** *UN1001, UN1021, S1001, or BC1001.*

- 2 **Statistics (not required):** *PSYC UN1610 (recommended), or STAT UN1001, UN1101, or UN1201.*

- 3 **Laboratory (not required):** *Any PSYC course numbered in the 1400s.*

- 4 **Group I (Perception & Cognition):** *Any PSYC course in the 2200s, 3200s, or 4200s.*

- 5 **Group II (Psychobio & Neuroscience):** *Any PSYC course in the 2400s, 3400s, 4400s. Also UN1010*.*

- 6 **Group III (Social, Personality, & Abnormal):** *Any 2600s, 3600s, or 4600s.*

- Other ("elective") courses: *May include up to 4 points of UN3950.*

Barnard psych courses: Up to 5 Barnard points may be applied as elective credit toward the concentration without DUS approval. Barnard courses approved to count toward specific requirements are listed on the Psychology Website under Degree Requirements; if you want to count a course not on that list, contact your DUS before enrolling.

Transfer credit: Psych courses taken at other institutions require DUS approval and a grade of B- or better in order to count toward the major. No more than 5 transfer credits (including any Barnard points) may be applied toward the concentration. See the "Transfer Credits" section of the Psychology Website under Degree Requirements for instructions and an application form.

*Students who have already taken UN1010 Mind, Brain, & Behavior should not take UN2430 as the content of the courses overlap significantly. Please refer to our overlapping courses section on our website.
